SESSION D A Workshop on Innovative Applications of Mind-Mapping as a Study Aid in Decision Sciences Courses

Presenter: **Brian J. Reithel**, University of Mississippi

This workshop will introduce participants to the basic principles of creating mind maps as they might be used by students enrolled in a decision sciences-related course. After covering the terminology and fundamental concepts used in building effective mind maps, the participants will engage in a discussion of various ways in which mind maps can be used as study aids to promote active learning in courses within our disciplines.

The presenter will also share the results of a semester-long study of the use of mind maps by students enrolled in a junior-level MIS course at a major southeastern university. These results will include both empirical and subjective impressions based upon student performance in the course. The results will also include summaries and excerpts from student feedback on the relative efficacy of the mind map as a study aid.

By the end of the workshop, participants will have learned the fundamentals of mind mapping, will have shared creative and innovative potential applications of this powerful idea recording technique that could be implemented in decision sciences-related courses, and will have drawn their own mind maps in order to become familiar with the process and benefits of using this powerful note-taking technique.
